KSRA PAC ANNOUNCES ENDORSEMENTS IN 2022 GENERAL ELECTION

TOPEKA (September 3, 2022) – The Kansas State Rifle Association PAC (KSRA PAC) today released its list of federal and state legislative endorsements for the 2022 General Election.

“In recent months, Joe Biden has publicly attacked the Second Amendment on a nearly daily basis and Sharice Davids has been carrying his water in Congress. Even before they redoubled their efforts at the federal level to placate the most extreme voices in their base, Laura Kelly and her allies in Topeka were already hard at work trying to dismantle our right to keep and bear arms. The gun-control Governor has stopped at nothing to veto Second Amendment-friendly legislation.

“Thankfully, Kansans overwhelmingly support the right to keep and bear arms and consistently vote their values at the polls. Kansas legislators have passed some of the strongest Second Amendment protections in the nation, and voters have twice approved pro-Second Amendment improvements to the Kansas Constitution by overwhelming margins. The Kansas State Rifle Association is committed to once again returning Second Amendment super majorities to the Kansas legislature, defeating gun-control Governor Laura Kelly, holding the Attorney General’s office, and sending a 100% pro-Second Amendment Kansas delegation to Washington, DC.”
